Campaign reminds drivers that actions have consequences LAW ENFORCEMENT BEGINS DRUNK DRIVING CRACKDOWN ON MARCH 16

Why: A five-year review of crash data indicates alcohol and drug use as well as lack of seat belts play a

significant role in fatal and serious injury crashes in March and early April. This period includes the National Collegiate Athletic Association men's and women's basketball tournaments, high school and
